

**Resolution 2003-09
Passed March 18, 2003**

A RESOLUTION ACKNOWLEDGING THE HISTORIC, SCENIC AND NATURAL QUALITIES OF THE OLENTANGY HERITAGE CORRIDOR STATE SCENIC BYWAY AND URGING THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (ODOT) TO RELOCATE THE HISTORIC HINDERER HOUSE DURING ANY WIDENING PROJECT FOR STATE ROUTE 750 AND TO PRESERVE THE BYWAY BY USING NATURAL, APPROPRIATE MATERIALS DURING THE STATE ROUTE 750 IMPROVEMENT PROJECT.

WHEREAS the Olentangy Heritage Corridor includes up to 900 foot elevation and;

WHEREAS, the Hinderer House, 1220 Powell Road, serves as an historic and visual landmark located in the major eastern entry way to the Powell/Liberty community and;

WHEREAS, the Hinderer House is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places because it is a classic example of a mid-nineteenth century Olentangy Valley residence and its specific architecture and;

WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) has proposed a widening of Powell Road that will impact the adjacent property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF POWELL, DELAWARE COUNTY, OHIO, THAT:

Section 1: The City of Powell Council hereby acknowledges the historic, serene and natural qualities of the Olentangy Heritage Corridor State Scenic Byway.

Section 2: The City of Powell Council urges the Department of Transportation to relocate the historic Hinderer House when they widen State Route 750.

Section 3: The Council of the Municipality of Powell urges the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) to preserve the Powell Road/State Route 315 hillsides and trees using appropriately designed retaining walls with materials such as Delaware Blue Limestone, which is typical of the scenic byway.


Section 4: That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of the decision making bodies of the Municipality of Powell which resulted in such formal actions were in meetings so open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements of the Municipality of Powell, Delaware County, Ohio.


Section 5: That this Resolution shall take effect at the earliest possible date permitted by law.

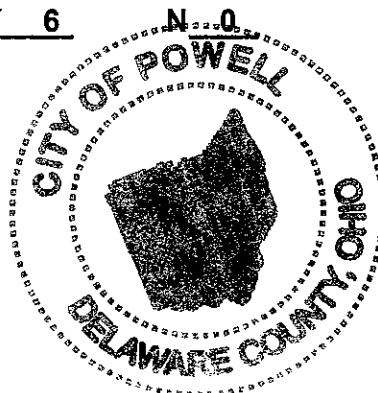
