

ORDINANCE 2004-65
Passed September 21, 2004

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING COMPLETION OF THE SELDOM SEEN ROAD AND SAWMILL PARKWAY TRAFFIC SIGNAL INSTALLATION AND APPURTENANCES, FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO SOLICIT BIDS, ACCEPT THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE RESPONSIVE AND BEST BIDS FOR THE ABOVE-REFERENCED PROJECT, AND CONTRACT THE PROJECT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THE ESTIMATES, IN ACCORDANCE WITH APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 2004 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Council has considered general estimates for completion of the Seldom Seen Road and Sawmill Parkway Traffic Signal Improvements and Appurtenances project in the amount of One Hundred Fifty Four Thousand Dollars and zero cents. (\$154,000.00), and

WHEREAS, Council has determined to proceed with completion of this capital improvement project during the year 2004, and has further authorized preparation of engineer's estimates and solicitation for bids, and

WHEREAS, it is hereby determined that an emergency exists to begin this project in consideration of the public health, safety and welfare.

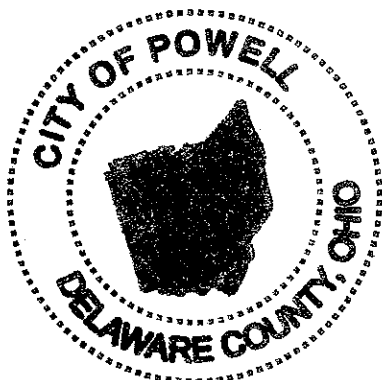
NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MUNICIPALITY OF POWELL, DELAWARE COUNTY, OHIO AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The City Engineer is directed to prepare final engineer's estimates and authorized to have plans and specifications prepared for bid for the completion of the Seldom Seen Road and Sawmill Parkway Traffic Signal Improvements and Appurtenances project, and to advertise for bids in a manner which the City Manager deems appropriate including an advertisement in a newspaper of general circulation in the Municipality for not less than two (2) nor more than four (4) consecutive weeks.

Section 2: The City Manager may reject any and all bids or accept a bid with the lowest responsible responsive bidder or bidders and contract with the bidder or bidders.

Section 3: The City Manager may not accept a bid in excess of ten percent (10%) of the City Engineer's estimate and the authorization for expenditure of funds contained herein shall not exceed the use of One Hundred Sixty Nine Thousand Four Hundred Dollars and zero cents. (\$169,400.00).

Section 4: That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council and that all deliberations of the Council and any of the decision making bodies of the Municipality of Powell which resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements of the Municipality of Powell, Delaware County, Ohio.




