ORDINANCE 2010-05
Adopted February 16, 2010

AN ORDINANCE MODIFYING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 2010; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, The City of Powell Council hereby determines that it is necessary to modify appropriations for the calendar year 2010 in accordance with the information attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF POWELL, DELAWARE COUNTY, OHIO AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That Council hereby modifies its appropriations for the calendar year 2010 by increasing certain accounts due to adjustments that need to be made to the funds. Council hereby determines to make the following adjustments:

Appropriate:

- 1. Street Maintenance Fund, Snow and Ice Removal, in the amount of \$75,000.00.

Section 2: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees which resulted in such formal actions were in meetings so open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements of the City of Powell, Delaware County, Ohio.

Section 3: That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City and its inhabitants for the reason that it is necessary to purchase additional supplies of road salt due to the shortage of supply and imminent weather conditions; wherefore, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
