**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 905.01 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF POWELL WITH REGARD TO DEFINITIONS FOR THE ANNUAL SIDEWALK REPAIR AND REPLACEMENT PROGRAM.**

**WHEREAS,** it is necessary from time to time to revise certain sections of the Codified Ordinances of Powell to provide for the health, safety and general welfare of Powell residents; and

**WHEREAS,** it is necessary to clarify the definition of the primary inspection area for the annual sidewalk repair and replacement program;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF POWELL, DELAWARE COUNTY, OHIO, AS FOLLOWS:**


**Section 1:** That Section 905.01 of the Codified Ordinances is hereby amended to read as set forth on the exhibit attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference.


**Section 2:** It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees which resulted in such formal actions were in meetings so open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements of the City of Powell, Delaware County, Ohio.

**Section 3:** This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest date allowed by law.

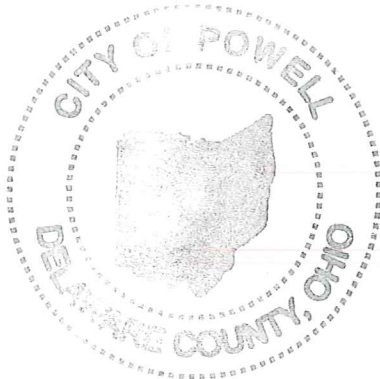
