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City's Largest Road Maintenance Project Gets Under Way

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Powell, OH: Work will begin this week on the City of Powell's largest street maintenance project to date.

The City's 2008 street resurfacing program includes work on 10 street segments and three bike paths within the City limits, at a total cost of \$858,061. The work is being done by Columbus Asphalt.

"The fact that this is the biggest road maintenance project that the City has done is a reflection of City Council's commitment to maintain our infrastructure," said Jeff Snyder, the City's public service director.

Work will begin in the Olentangy Ridge subdivision and move south. Snyder said the project should be completed by mid-November, weather permitting.

The project includes milling, paving, spot repair, sealing, spot curb work and overlay as needed on the various road segments. Streets and bike paths included as part of the project are as follows:

- Industrial Park Place, from West Olentangy Street to the end.
- Eagle View Court, in the cul-de-sac.
- Rosewood Court, in the cul-de-sac.
- Beech Ridge Drive, from the Powder Room shooting range to Muladore Drive.
- Hopewell Drive, from Olentangy Ridge Place to Ridge Side Drive.
- Grandshire, from Sawmill Road to Mandalay Court.
- All of Woodedge Circle.
- Raccoon Run, from Eagle Ridge to Retreat Lane.
- Ridge Side Drive, from Liberty Street to Muladore Drive and from Muladore to Hopewell Drive.
- Bennett Parkway bikepath from Charterhouse Court to SR 750.
- SR 750 bikepath from Bennett Parkway to Sycamore Road.
- Pavement markings on West Olentangy Street at the CSX railroad crossing.

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
