Significant Cases for the Month:

- At the beginning of December, there were multiple reports of UPS and Fed Ex deliveries being removed from residences after delivery was made. The thefts were reported several days after the deliveries were expected. Suspects have since been identified and charges are forthcoming.
- Auto accidents increased 68 percent in December, largely due to weather conditions. When inclement weather happens, maintain a speed appropriate for road conditions, allow extra stopping distance and always buckle your seat belt.

Training

In the final month of training, the agency completed 30 minutes of training with all employees on the operation of the Temporary Holding Facility, which is required each year.

Additionally, Deputy Chief Hrytzik attended a training seminar on Developing Labor Law at the State Employee Relations Board; Sgt. Sallows attended a workshop on Ohio Public Records Laws; and Ofc. Boruchowitz completed a 40-hour training course in First Line Supervision.

For the year, the agency participated in more than 1,960 hours of training, which averages more than 100 hours per employee.
