A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF POWELL TO APPROVE THE **DELAWARE FINAL PLAN FOR NEXT GENERATION 9-1-1.**

- WHEREAS. The Delaware County Final Plan is a document that provides information about 9-1-1 service in the county. The document includes required technical information for service providers, lists subdivisions served by the Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), cost information, and other operational aspects of the organization.; and
- WHEREAS. In 2023, The State of Ohio passed legislation as part of House Bill 33 -135th General Assembly, which included significant revisions to Chapter 128 of the Ohio Revised Code. Chapter 128, 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone Systems.
- WHEREAS. House Bill 33 included Governor Mike DeWine's budget for the State of Ohio, including funding for Next Generation 9-1-1 (NG9-1-1) development in Ohio; and
- WHEREAS. ORC 128.07 (B2) requires the County Final Plan to be filed with the State of Ohio by April 3, 2024. The revised legislation includes numerous requirements for information that must be included in the final plan, to include NG9-1-1 information.; and
- WHEREAS, The plan requires approval by the legislative authority of the municipalities and townships served by the Delaware County Emergency Communications PSAP through each authority's resolution process; and
- WHEREAS, Council has similarly determined that it is beneficial for the City of Powell to participate in such an agreement.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF POWELL, COUNTY OF **DELAWARE, STATE OF OHIO, AS FOLLOWS:**
- The Council of the City of Powell hereby authorizes the City Manager to Section 1: execute an agreement, which agreement shall be in substantially similar form to the agreement attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference.
- It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of Council and that all deliberations of Council and any of the decision-making bodies of the City of Powell, which resulted in such formal actions, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements of the City of Powell, Delaware County, Ohio.

Background

A County Final Plan is a document that provides information about 9-1-1 service in the county. The document includes required technical information for service providers, lists subdivisions served by the Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), cost information, and other operational aspects of the organization.

In 2023, Ohio passed legislation as part of House Bill 33 – 135th General Assembly, which included significant revisions to Chapter 128 of the Ohio Revised Code. Chapter 128, 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System, governs Ohio PSAP's operations. House Bill 33 included Governor Mike DeWine's budget for the State of Ohio, including funding for Next Generation 9-1-1 (NG9-1-1) development in Ohio. The funding of NG9-1-1 has sped up the timeline for developing the Emergency Services IP Network (ESInet). An ESInet is required for the functionality of NG9-1-1 technology.

ORC 128.07 (B2) requires the County Final Plan to be filed with the State of Ohio by April 3, 2024. The revised legislation includes numerous requirements for information that must be included in the final plan, to include NG9-1-1 information. Therefore, the new Final Plan enclosed was written to meet these requirements.

Plan Approval

On February 8, 2024, the County Final Plan received approval by resolution from the Delaware County Board of Commissioners per ORC 128.07. The plan now requires approval by the legislative authority of the municipalities and townships served by the Delaware County Emergency Communications PSAP through each authority's resolution process. Failure to respond is deemed disapproval under ORC 128.08 (A).

Please accept this memo as a recommendation for approval by your legislative authority.

Next Steps

While ORC 128.08 allows for sixty days from receipt to respond to the plan, please place the approval of the County Final Plan on the agenda for the soonest legislative meeting possible so that it can be addressed through each authority's resolution process. Upon approval, please forward such approval to me either by electronic means or USPS mail. The approvals will be gathered, and the plan will be filed with the Ohio 9-1-1 Program Office by the deadline of April 3, 2024.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 128.06(C)(2) of the Revised Code, the board of county commissioners shall serve as the 9-1-1 program review committee; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 128.07(B)(2) of the Revised Code, the 9-1-1 program review committee shall file a copy of its final plan with the Ohio 9-1-1 Program Office not later than six months after the effective date of this amendment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 128.08 of the Revised Code, a board of county commissioners shall act by resolution to approve or disapprove the final plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Delaware County, State of Ohio (the "Board"), that:

Section 1. The Board hereby approves the new Delaware County Final Plan.

Section 2. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.

DELCOMM receives oversight from the permanently established 9-1-1 Board. The duties of the 9-1-1 Board are explained in the *By-Laws of the Delaware County 9-1-1 Board* document. The board is comprised of stakeholders throughout Delaware County. Members include the following:

- City Manager of Delaware
- City Manager of Powell
- Delaware County Sheriff or Representative of Sheriff
- Delaware County Commissioners' Representative
- City of Delaware Police Chief
- Law Enforcement Representative selected by the Law Enforcement Management Group
- Three (3) Fire Chiefs selected by the Fire Chiefs Association, one of whom shall be with a volunteer/part-time fire service
- A Township Trustee selected by and representative of the Township Trustees Association
- EMS Representative selected by the County Commissioners
- Non-voting representative of the State Highway Patrol
- Non-voting County Administrator of Delaware County

Revenue and Costs

Pages four and five address revenue and costs for DELCOMM. However, additional detail for this plan is warranted.

Costs: Page four requires a projection of the initial cost to establish, equip, and furnish the PSAP. As an already established PSAP, this is irrelevant. However, the cost cited, \$32,500, is the quoted cost for the required equipment to connect to the state ESInet for NG9-1-1 functionality.

Page four lists the operating and maintenance costs for the last five years, 2019-2023, for a total of \$22,707,165.45.

Revenue and Costs (cont'd)

Revenues: DELCOMM's revenue primarily comes from the five-year countywide levy on real property and mobile home taxes.

DELCOMM receives additional revenue from the Government Assistance Fund. These funds are kept in a separate 9-1-1 fund and are expended on those expenses authorized by ORC 128.57.

Compliance with Ohio Administrative Code 5507

DELCOMM must comply with OAC 5507, also called the "Ohio PSAP Operating Rules," which specifies technical and operational standards that promote industry best practices. Compliance is verified yearly through an audit by the Ohio 9-1-1 Program Office, which examines documentation provided by DELCOMM demonstrating compliance with each operating rule.

Emergency Medical Dispatch Instructions

DELCOMM provides callers with emergency medical dispatch (EMD) instructions. All DELCOMM staff are trained in the Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials (APCO) EMD protocols and must complete ongoing continuing education and pass a biennial exam to maintain certification.

Additional Law Enforcement Agencies in Delaware County

DELCOMM shares a co-located center with the Delaware County Sheriff's Office (DCSO) dispatchers. DELCOMM and DCSO function independently of one another, and DCSO is not a PSAP. DCSO dispatches for multiple law enforcement agencies in the county, including the following: Delaware County Sherriff's Office, Genoa Twp. Police, Shawnee Hills Police, Sunbury Police, Preservation Parks of Delaware County, and Ashley Police.
